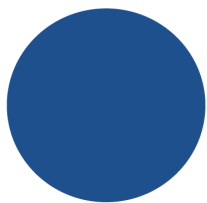

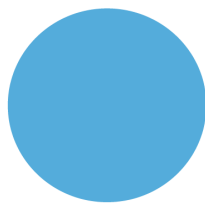

Colours

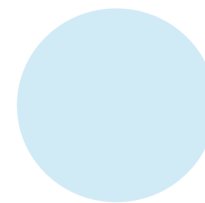
<i>Keyword Inspiration</i>	City, building, urban, sustainability, environment, fresh/clean
<i>Colour influence</i>	Greens/Blues are associated with sustainability and the environment. In addition, analogous colours are very similar, and therefore they look balanced, harmonious and work seamlessly together.
<i>Colours: Primary</i>	Greens, blues
<i>Colours: Secondary</i>	Purple
<i>Notes</i>	The tone of each colour can be adjusted to 30% transparency to create more depth within design elements and highlighting cues.
<i>Text</i>	Dark grey
<i>Background Colour</i>	White



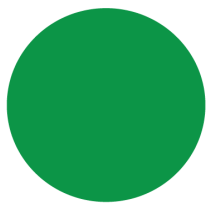

Highlighting Cues: Charts, Maps and Images

<i>Colours</i>	Primary and Secondary colours at 30% transparency, ensuring contrast using a Colour Contrast Analyser (contrast ratio of at least 4.5:1).
<i>Importance</i>	Cueing helps with learning retention and decreased response time for activities such as searching a screen for visual cues.

Charts

<i>Visual</i>	Solid box, no stroke or empty box, solid stroke
<i>Treatment</i>	30% transparency, with Blending Mode: Overlay
<i>Animation</i>	Position and opacity

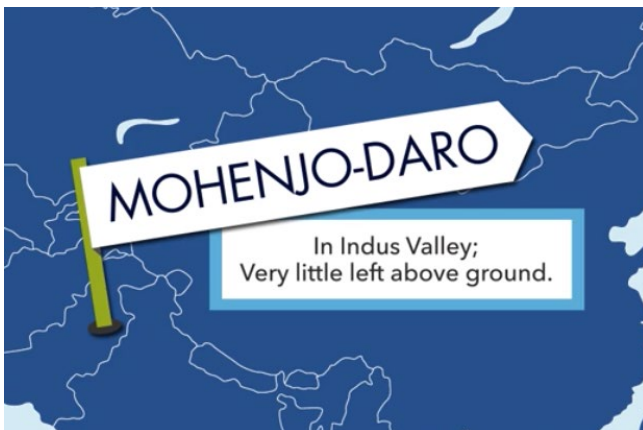
<i>Visuals</i>	City	Location marker

<i>Animation</i>	These markers will “bounce” animate in using AE Expressions

Highlighting Cues

Images

<i>Visual</i>	Drawn dotted lines for emphasis on specific area in image
<i>Treatment</i>	Solid white, dotted line, brush size: 6.5 pt
<i>Importance</i>	Adding graphical emphasis shows the user which part of the image is being referenced, reducing the time to search the screen.
<i>Animation</i>	Opacity

Image Highlighting examples:



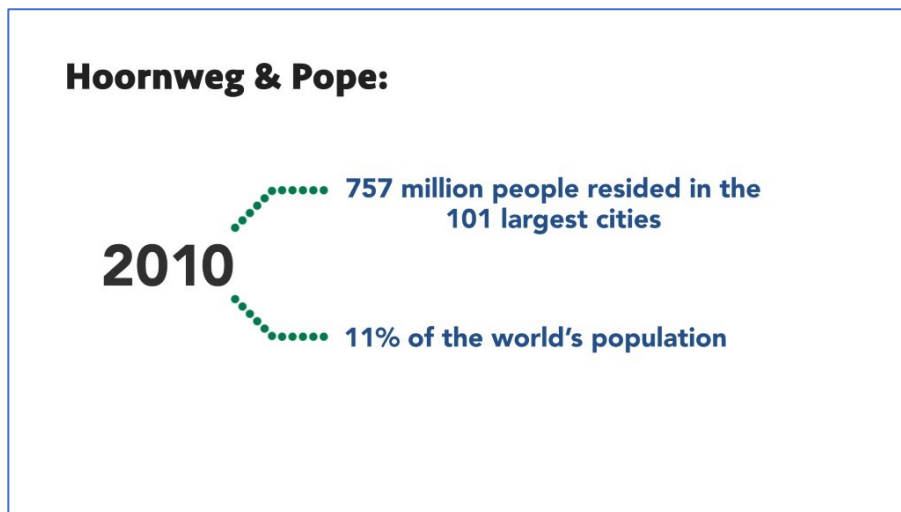
<i>Visual</i>	For more than 1 image on screen: focused image is coloured, second image is in black and white
<i>Animation</i>	Saturation



Page Layout

<i>Visual</i>	Text/Images on screen, white background
<i>Treatment</i>	All text/images should have white/negative space surrounding it
<i>Importance</i>	<p>This showcases information to the learners allowing them to focus on the content, rather than the design.</p> <p>Using patterns or graphic backgrounds can decrease legibility and will have an impact on readability. White space visually separates elements, and it also assists the viewer to visualize and understand how all the elements work together.</p>

<i>Visual</i>	Title of each Module, separated onto two lines	
<i>Treatment</i>	Top line text	Avenir Next Bold
	Bottom line text	Avenir Next, 80% Text grey
<i>Animation</i>	Position (from left) and opacity, top line enters scene before bottom by 1 second.
